**AGENDA APPROVED:** Motion by Dickson, second by Brockmann that the agenda be approved as presented. All ayes. Motion carried.

**MOTION FOR EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Motion by Dickson, second by Ayers that the Board hold a closed session as provided in Section 21.5(1)(i) of the open meetings law to evaluate the professional competency of an individual whose performance is being considered to prevent needless and irreparable injury to that individual's reputation, as that individual has requested a closed session. Roll call vote. Ayes – Anderson, Ayers, Brockmann, Dickson, Hoskins, Nels, Wagle. Nays – none. Motion carried.

**COMMUNICATIONS:** President Wagle welcomed everyone to the meeting and read the vision of the District: It is the vision of the Pleasant Valley Community School District that we shall provide the finest academic and extra-curricular programs in the state – not in some things, but in everything; not for some students, but for every student.

Dr. Spelhaug announced that 102 - \$1,000 Pleasant Valley Educational Foundation Scholarships were awarded at the PVEF scholarship night on May 8<sup>th</sup>. He thanked the foundation board and the community for their efforts and generosity. Also recognized were all who participated in the PVEF golf event – golfers, contributors, and volunteers. Particular thanks were given to Arconic for their long-standing title sponsorship of the event.

**RECOGNITION:** Mr. Ayers on behalf of the Board thanked the Pleasant Valley High School PTA who provided dinner for the board in celebration of School Board Recognition Month. The PVHS PTA shared the following: *"Alone we can do so little; together we can do so much."* *On behalf of the Pleasant Valley High School PTA, we thank each board member as well as the support staff that surrounds you for your time and service to our school district. Our district's success is a direct reflection of the work that you do for us and we recognize your efforts.*

- Spartan Shield online became a School Newspapers Online Distinguished Site of 2019; 19th of 397 in the nation.
- Maya McClain received Honorable Mention Award for Journalistic Photographer of the Year.

**RECOGNITION:** Alton Barber shared with the Board his experiences in competing for the Herbert Hoover Uncommon Student Award, which annually honors Iowa high school juniors who propose and then accomplish a project of their choosing and design. Alton described his project as follows: “My program gives students in second through sixth grades with learning differences a chance to participate in FIRST robotics at the same level as any other team. My goal was for the students to have fun and be exposed to basic robotics principles.” Alton was awarded a \$1,500 initial participation scholarship as well as one of three \$5,000 grand prize scholarships.

- Open Enrollment:
  - 2018-19: One IN from Bettendorf (grade 1), two IN from Davenport (grade 2 & 4), one IN from Central Community School District DeWitt (grade 5).
  - 2019-20: Seven IN from Bettendorf (5 kindergarten, one grade 3, one grade 5); three IN from Davenport (3 kindergarten); two IN from North Scott (one kindergarten, one grade 4). One application IN denied from Bettendorf (grade 1).

Mr. Jeffrey Bittner, parent of the 1<sup>st</sup> grade child whose open enrollment was denied, addressed the Board regarding his disagreement with the district's decision. He believes the district is discriminating based on the child's special learning needs. District attorney Mikkie Schultz reviewed the district policy on open enrollment decisions being made for all students on the basis of available space.

**DEBRIEF ON WEATHER RELATED MAKE UP DAYS:** At the two previous board meetings, 2019-20 school year options for making up school days cancelled for inclement weather were discussed. The board discussed priorities in determining the most effective ways to make up days so that student learning is best supported. The Pleasant Valley Education Association and the Board agrees that February 14<sup>th</sup>, 2020, a scheduled no school day, is the first day that will be used as a make-up day. Any remaining days will be made up by extending the school day Monday – Thursday the weeks of March 9<sup>th</sup> and March 23<sup>rd</sup> and by adding days to the end of the year (currently scheduled to end on June 5<sup>th</sup>). The Board and PVEA earlier agreed that the elimination of early out days was detrimental to professional development, so will not be an option in making up future cancelled days. Note that the first day of school and the last day of school fall on a Friday for the 2019-20 school year.

No required motion.

## 2019-20 FOOD SERVICE BIDS:

**Bread Bid:** Invitations for bread bids were mailed on April 1, 2019 and opened on May 9, 2019.

Alpha Baking Company and Bimbo Bakeries submitted bids. Alpha Baking Company was the lowest overall bid by \$7,800. Alpha Baking Company has been a vendor for the district in the past. Andrea recommends Alpha Baking Company be awarded the Bread Bid for the 2019-20 school year.

**Milk Bid:** Invitations for milk bids were mailed on April 1, 2019 and opened on May 9, 2019. Anderson Erickson and Prairie Farms both submitted bids. Prairie Farms was the lowest overall bid by \$6,000.00.

Prairie Farms has provided good products and services in the past. Food Service Director Andrea Mahler recommends Prairie Farms be awarded the Milk Bid for the 2019-20 school year.

**Pizza Bid:** Invitations for pizza bids were mailed on April 1, 2019 and opened on May 9, 2019. Little Caesar's, Domino's, Happy Joes, and Papa John's submitted bids with the lowest bid of \$6.00 per pizza. As stated in the bid request, the district may choose not to use delivery pizza at all or may use more than one vendor for the 2019-20 school year. Ms. Mahler recommends Little Caesar's, Domino's, Happy Joes, and Papa John's be awarded the Pizza Bid for the 2019-20 school year.

**Beverage Bid:** As stated in the 2016-2017 beverage bid, we reserved the right to roll over our beverage bid with the vendor for up to five years. Based on quality and price, Ms. Mahler recommends we roll over our beverage bid with Pepsi for the 2019-20 school year.

**Distributor Bid:** Starting in 2017, 6 Iowa Schools formed the Eastern Iowa School Food Cooperative, Pleasant Valley, Bettendorf, North Scott, Central Dewitt, Durant, and Camanche. Ms. Mahler recommends rolling over the prime vendor bid to Kohl Wholesale for the 2019-2020 school year. Kohl Wholesale has been our prime vendor for several years.

Motion by Dickson, second by Ayers that the Board accept the bread products bid submitted by Alpha Baking Company for the 2019-20 school year. Roll call vote. Ayes – Anderson, Ayers, Brockmann, Dickson, Hoskins, Nels, Wagle. Nays – none. Motion carried.

Motion by Anderson, second by Dickson that the Board accept the low milk products bid submitted by Prairie Farms for the 2019-20 school year. Roll call vote. Ayes – Anderson, Ayers, Brockmann, Dickson, Hoskins, Nels, Wagle. Nays – none. Motion carried.

Motion by Nels, second by Brockmann that the Board accept the low pizza bid submitted by Little Caesar's, Happy Joe's, Papa John's and Domino's for the 2019-20 school year. Roll call vote. Ayes – Anderson, Ayers, Brockmann, Dickson, Hoskins, Nels, Wagle. Nays – none. Motion carried.

**IOWA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SCHOOL NUTRITION PROGRAM ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW:** On March 26-28, a school nutrition program administrative review of operations at PVCSD was conducted and focused on areas defined by the USDA. Just two findings were identified. One related to tracking of employee training; the second highlighted the cash balance which exceeded the recommended threshold of three months' operating expenses. Ms. Mahler put into place the recommended spreadsheet to track training, and it was noted that additional cash was on hand for future Forest Grove kitchen expenses. Subsequently the district initiated the transfer of funds over a three year period to the capital project fund.

Motion by Anderson, second by Ayers that the board accept the Iowa Department of Education School Nutrition Program Administrative Review as presented. Roll call vote. Ayes – Anderson, Ayers, Brockmann, Dickson, Hoskins, Nels, Wagle. Nays – none. Motion carried.

**LEGISLATIVE UPDATE:** Iowa Senator Chris Cournoyer and Representative Gary Mohr updated the Board on 2019 legislative activity and accomplishments pertaining to education. The Board thanked the legislators for their service and for efforts in obtaining extension of the SAVE (Secure an Advanced Vision for Education) penny sales tax for school infrastructure through January 1, 2021. The Board began preliminary discussion of 2020 legislative priorities.

No required motion.

**TIMBER'S EDGE II ASSIGNED TO CODY ATTENDANCE AREA:** To ease enrollment pressure at Bridgeview Elementary, the Board preliminarily discussed the possibility of assigning the proposed Timber's Edge II subdivision to Cody Elementary. The subdivision will be located north of the fire station, and 40 new homes are anticipated. Further consideration will be given during the May 28<sup>th</sup>, June 10<sup>th</sup> and June 24<sup>th</sup> board meetings.

No required motion.

**PLEASANT VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL ADDITION AND REMODEL CHANGE ORDERS:** The remaining change orders wrap up the project and do not affect the expected contingency balance.

The deadline for filing an Open Enrollment Application for students in grades 1-12 is **March 1<sup>st</sup>** prior to the school year of requested attendance. The deadline for filing an open enrollment request for an incoming kindergarten child is September 1<sup>st</sup> of the year open enrollment is first requested. IMPORTANT NOTICE TO PLEASANT VALLEY SCHOOL DISTRICT PARENTS OR GUARDIANS WITH CHILDREN ATTENDING NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS:

Per Iowa Code Section 285.3, in order to qualify for parental reimbursement, a parent or guardian of a student attending an accredited nonpublic school who furnishes transportation for the student in accordance with this section, shall submit a notice of nonpublic school attendance to the resident public school district, notifying the district that the student is enrolled in and will attend an accredited nonpublic school during the period for which parental reimbursement is being requested. The notice shall be filed with the resident public school district not later than December 1 for the first semester claim and May 1 for the second semester claim each year. Forms which must be filled out in order to qualify for this parental reimbursement are available at the Belmont Administration Center, 525 Belmont Road, Bettendorf, Iowa 52722 and on the district website at <http://www.pleasval.k12.ia.us>. **Information needed to complete the form includes the parent or guardian's name and address, the name, age, and grade level of the student, the name of the nonpublic school and its location and the number of miles one way to transport the child from home to school. Iowa Code Section 285.1, subsection 3, limits the number of students that may be eligible for parent reimbursement to a maximum of three (3) elementary students and one (1) high school student per family.**


